Tuition fee:

For EU citizens 1200 EUR per semester.

For citizens outside the EU the tuition fee is 2000 EUR per semester

Students must have a passport valid for at least a year from the beginning of the academic year, and visa if required.

Application documents:

- Copy of university diploma (obligatory)

Sociology Programme: the programme mainly – but not exclusively – expects candidates having obtained a degree from the field of humanities and social sciences.

International Studies Programme: the programme mainly – but not exclusively – expects candidates having obtained a degree from the field of social sciences, communications or cultural studies.

Interdisciplinary Social Research Programme: the programme mainly – but not exclusively – expects candidates having obtained a degree from the field of social sciences, humanities, economics, law or engineering studies.

- Evidence of sufficient proficiency in English to be able to read English academic literature, to write academic papers in English and to participate in English-language courses: a copy of the certificate of English language proficiency and the results/scores (TOEFL, IELTS, GRE, etc.) equivalent to the Council of Europe's Common European Framework of Reference Level B2 or above. If the applicant's language of instruction during their previous training was English, a university degree or high school diploma will suffice. (obligatory)

- Curriculum Vitae (1–2 pages) in English with original (not copied) signature (obligatory)

- Research plan signed by applicant (obligatory)

- Motivation letter (obligatory)

- A statement by the supervisor that they accept the role of supervisor/tutor until the end of the student's academic career (optional)

- Reference work (length no more than 6000 words), which is an earlier work done by the applicant (e.g.: workshop work, shortened version of a thesis or published scientific paper) (obligatory)

- List of publications (optional)

- Copy of awards in professional competitions (optional)

- A letter of recommendation in English from a qualified supervisor (optional)

- Transcript of university courses taken (obligatory)

- Copy of the application fee transfer (obligatory)

Admission process

The admission procedure is based on the same requirements and conditions for each programme. The admission is evaluated by the following aspects:

- the applicant's academic results, list of publications and language skills,
- feasibility of the research plan,
- and professional skills shown at the interview.

The admission committee evaluates the candidate's scientific aptitude, scientific achievements and the quality of the research plan. The admission committee suggests a ranking of the candidates, and the admission decision is made by the Doctoral Council of the Faculty of Social Sciences.

Date of the admission decision: August 1, 2025 the latest.

Applicants with a significant scientific output may be admitted to a thesis-only option.
