Oktatás célja:

The course gives an introduction into the planning and functioning of EU policies. Its aim is to give students basic political and legal knowledge about these policies. The first part of the semester gives a general introduction into the background of the policies, including the related theories, their planning and their enforcement. After this, the rest of the semester focuses on special topics covering special policies. As the course uses knowledge already acquired on other courses, it is very important that students must be aware of the basics of EU decision making, institutional structure and most important concepts.

Evaluation

- Apart of the above mentioned literature, questions can also be asked based on the actual lectures of the professors.
- Students take a written exam in the examination period.
 - The test consists 20 multiple choice tests („A-B-C-D”), and the student must also write a one sentence explanation to explain his/her choice. Each correct answer is worth 1 point.
 - The test also includes three essay questions. Students must answer at least two of them properly



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to receive a grade other than mark 1.
